"He showed me that I can use my talents and my profession to reach others in the world.... I will be telling everyone all about what God has showed me and how much love I have for Him." **-Milton**

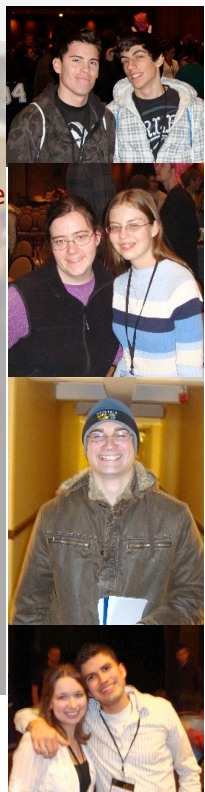
"During DCC, there was a realization. We need to seek God's glory every day, because if we don't, we will miss opportunities to share the Gospel to this hurting world." **-Kayla**
